Special Assistant to the President (SAP) Christopher Lawrence "Bong" Go on Tuesday vowed to help the government expand its lending program for micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

Go, who is running for senator in the 2019 noted elections. that administration the of President Rodrigo Duterte has paved the way for an improved business climate in the country.

Among others, he cited the passage of the Ease of Doing Business Act, the launch of the 8888-hotline for complaints against fixers, scalawags, corruption or poor government service, as well as Malacanang's order requiring government offices to respond to all public requests and concerns with 15 days from receipt.

Go noted that Duterte's moves against red tape are meant to make it easy for ordinary people to start their own businesses.

Go also noted that Duterte is unrelenting in his campaign against corruption that the Chief Executive had fired several officials who are close to him or helped him in his presidential campaign because

alleged corruption.

PCOO chief vows comprehensive coverage of 'Wagayway Festival'

MANILA - Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO) Secretary Martin Andanar said government media will conduct comprehensive coverage of the "Wagayway Festival" in Imus, Cavite in May this year.

Speaking to members of the Cavite Province Publishers League, Inc. (CPPLI) on Thursday, Andanar said he had discussed the matter with Imus City Mayor Emmanuel Maliksi and vowed to utilize the PCOO agencies to cover the annual event.

"I promised the mayor that the government media this year will be 100 percent behind the celebration of Wagayway sapagkat ito po ay history ng bansa natin, napakahalaga po nito (because this is a significant part of our country's history) and he just gave me a very good presentation kung ano yung ginagawa sa Imus including the branding, ako'y bumilib (of what is being done in Imus, including the branding, I was impressed)," he said.

Andanar said he has been going around the country to personally meet and listen to the sentiments of the local chief executives and media practitioners.

"You only get all these lessons if you engage, if you go down the regions, the provinces," he said.

Andanar, a former media practitioner, said his lifelong advocacies are strengthening media interests through policies, media engagement, and media solutions.

The first Philippine flag was raised and waved by the Filipino revolutionaries during the "Battle of Alapan" on May 28, 1898 in Imus, making it the "Flag Capital" of the country.

In the same meeting with CPPLI, Andanar also vouched for the integrity of four senatorial bets -- reelectionist Senator Aquilino 'Koko' Pimentel, former Special Assistant to the President Christopher Lawrence "Bong" Go, former Philippine National Police chief Ronald "Bato" dela Rosa, and former Presidential Political Affairs Adviser Francis Tolentino. of the Interior and Local Government Secretary Eduardo Año for all LGUs to take part in the massive Manila Bay rehabilitation program.

The project has three phases -- the massive cleanup of esteros, rivers and streams connecting to the Bay area; resettlement of informal settlers and removal of illegal structures; and massive information dissemination.

This city's village chiefs led the cleaning of the Malabon Grande River from Javalera, Biclatan, Manggahan, San Francisco, Buenavista, Pasong Kawayan, Tapia, Pinagtipunan, Prinza, GenTri Proper, Dulong Bayan, Bacao and the Ilang Ilang River which crosses Barangay San Antonio in nearby Noveleta town.

Also, scores of barangay volunteers retrieved piles of garbage and plastics from the rivers such as Ilang-Ilang River in Noveleta, Tanza River which connects Barangay San Juan and Tejero in this city from Barangay Biwas in Tanza town.

Meanwhile, Noveleta town Mayor Dino Reyes Chua and other officials joined hundreds of volunteers in Saturday's cleanup drive along Ilang-Ilang River up to Barangay San Rafael and the Long Beach which stretches from Barangay San Rafael III to San Rafael IV.

Sen. JV Ejercito's bill seeks to grant civil service eligibility to SK kagawads

SENATOR Ejercito is pushing for an amendment to the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015 (Republic Act No. 10742), or the SK Reform law, so that SK kagawads can be granted Civil Service Eligibility.

He filed Senate Bill No. 2185 as he noted that SK kagawads are not included in the list of Elective Barangay

Officials to be provided or granted with first level eligibility under the Civil Service Rules.

Based on the Civil Service Rules, a Barangay Official Eligibility, which is equivalent to Career Service Sub-professional Eligibility, is a privilege granted to barangay officials, including SK chairpersons.

"The proposed bill seeks grant to

the same, if not more fitting privilege to SK kagawads, recognizing them also as barangay elected officials," Ejercito said.

Career Service Subprofessional Eligibility is suitable for first level positions in government or job positions, which involve clerical, trades, crafts, and custodial service.

Assistant Secretary

Victor A. del Rosario, commissioner National Youth Commission expressed support for the bill.

"As always, view Sen. JV Ejercito as our 'youth champion' in the Senate and we thank him again, particularly for this bill that recognizes the hard work and commitment of our SK officials," he said. #####






