Duterte sees high-quality

MANILAPresident Rodrigo Duterte on Thursday said he

sees the establishment of more "high-quality" and "good-impact" projects between the Philippines and China.

Duterte made this remark before he sat down with Chinese President Xi Jinping for a bilateral meeting on the sidelines of the 2nd Belt and Road Forum for International Cooperation in Beijing, China.

"The sooner they are completed, the sooner people on the ground will feel the benefits of Philippine-China relations," Duterte said in his speech.

He also expressed hope that the two countries work together to explore new areas of cooperation and partnership.

"We look forward to a productive discussion on matters of mutual interest and concern," Duterte said.

Duterte, thanked the Chinese leader for his personal invitation to the forum, describing it as a chance to further strengthen ties.

"The forum provides another opportunity to renew and reaffirm our valued relations based on mutual trust, respect, and friendship and must continue to grow strength and meaning in the coming years," Duterte said.

He also described Xi's visit to the Philippines in November last year as "a watershed moment in the Philippine-China ties".

Duterte, meanwhile,

greeted China in its 70th founding anniversary and lauded its economic accomplishments that made China the second largest economy in the world.

The Philippines congratulates China on its economic achievements," Duterte said.

"The decision to elevate bilateral ties to a comprehensive, strategic cooperation affirms the Philippines and China's strong desire to further deepen and broaden this engagement," he added.

Duterte's trip to China is his fourth since assuming the presidency in 2016. He also attended the 1st Belt and Road Forum in May 2017. (PNA)

Sen. Ejercito wants a Senate probe on sugar price rise in Metro Manila

Ejercito Senator JV wants officials of the Department of Trade and Industry, Department of Agriculture, and the Sugar Regulatory Board to explain in a Senate investigation the "highly irregular" sugar price increase in Metro Manila and other parts of the country.

This developed as Ejercito, author of the "Sugar Cane Industry Development Act" law, is set to file a resolution calling for a Senate probe on the rising price of sugar. "I

file will resolution urging the Senate to investigate the increase of sugar price, especially here in Manila. One of the directions of this investigation is to unmask the people behind this," he said in a statement.

He added: "But what is important and urgent right now is a quick government intervention to lower the price and protect the consumers and end-users as well as the sugar farmers and producers."

Ejercito suspected that some "dirty hands" were manipulating the market price, whether wholesale or retail, since the production was high and the supply was adequate.

Levelling off activity conditions of migration facilitated Ms.Jennylyn Jucutan of the National Economic Development Authority (NEDA). NEDA IV-Á Regional Director Luis G. Banua led the session on "Migration and Development 101" which focused on understanding the history, patterns and features of international Filipino migration, distinguishing the duality of migration, its social costs and benefits to migrants, their families, communities and country, and appreciating the ways of harnessing the development potential of international migration. Dir. Banua also pointed out that according to the Calabarzon Migration Data, movements of migration growth in the Calabarzon region has increased. Cavite is one of the contributors of the top sending region in terms of migration as reflected by the number of sea farers in the province.

Director Banua also enlightened the attendees on the positive and negative effects of migration on migrants, their families and the community. He also echoed the important LGU roles including the policies, services, multistakeholder partnerships and institutional capacity affected

development and dynamics.

Cavite Governor Jesus Crispin "Boying" Remulla appreciated the efforts initiated by the PSWDO and NEDA to come up with the orientation and seminar/workshop for the awareness of the status of migration and development in the province. The governor emphasized the idea that migration leads to brain drain and said that it is only temporary since the world has now become united by technology through digital infrastructure. He added that the fiber optic project in the province will be fully operational in the coming days and will address the separation of families since the digital infra will bridge the distance and make communication easier. The governor also said that the provincial government works on strengthening its employment services to give more jobs to Cavitenos. Access on basic services has already been implemented to reach the poor communities.

The session Mainstreaming Migration and Development in Local Development Planning and Governance was led by Ms. Lovely Morres, OIC-Supervising Economic Development Specialist of NEDA IV-A.

Her session concentrated on the assistance that they may provide for the LGU's in integrating migration and development into their local planning and provide them with a sample menu of services that can be offered for the migrants and their families. Her lecture also showed the services that may be extended to provide pertinent information on international migration, issues of migrants and the national government agencies involved in migration and development initiatives so the LGus could link up with them. LRT-1 Cavite extension construction set in May



MANILA construction of the extension of the Light Rail Transit Line 1 (LRT-1) is set to start in May, the Department Transportation (DOTr) said.

"We'll have an event on May 6 to start the actual works of LRT Line 1 Cavite Extension Project. We will send an advisory soon," DOTr Assistant Secretary for Communications Goddes Hope Libiran said in a text message to the Philippine News Agency (PNA) on Wednesday.

railway project will have eight stations from Baclaran in Parañaque City to Bacoor in the province of Cavite, reducing travel time to 30 minutes from the current one-anda-half hours during rush hours.

The passenger volume of the LRT-1 is expected to increase from 300,000 to 800,000 once it is completed.

The DOTr and the railway system's private operator, Light Rail Manila Corp., are eyeing to finish the project by the fourth quarter of 2021. (PNA)

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite -- The Commission (Comelec) Elections disclosed here Tuesday that it has already tested the counting voting machines in 23 towns and cities in the province to ensure the equipment's integrity in the upcoming May 13 mid-term polls.

Lawyer Arnulfo Pioquinto, Comelec Cavite provincial election supervisor, told the Philippine News Agency (PNA), that the election officers of each town and city have undertaken their seminars on the election processes, specifically on the operation of the VCMs and the electronic counting procedures.

"These activities on the VCM demonstration have been lined up by the local Comelec offices before the actual election to be aware of everything that would happen on election day for a 'Malayang Halalan 2019' (Free and Election Fair 2019)," Pioquinto said.

He said 14 out of the 23 election officers have been reshuffled beginning March 27 or two days before the start of the local election campaign period last March 29 to ensure clean and fair



Sambong | Blumea balsamifera DC, medicinal herb, is widely distributed in Eastern and Southeastern Asia. It has been used in folk medicine for its many benefits that include the treatment of septic wounds, respiratory infections. stomach pains and kidney stones. Scientific Name: Blumea balsamifera L. DC Also knows as: Alibum, Lakadbulan. Sambong Lalakdan. (Tag.), Dalapot, Sobsob, Gabuen. Subusub, Blumea camphor (Engl.), Kambibon, Ngai camphor (Engl.).

Sambong is used as herbal medicine and is a shrub that grows wild in the tropical climate countries such as Philippines, India, Africa and found even in eastern Himalayas.

Sambong is widely used in the Philippines as herbal medicine. Sambong leaves are known for its ngai or Blumea camphor that is used as herbal medicine to treat kidney stones, wounds and cuts, rheumatism, antidiarrhea, anti spasms, colds and coughs and hypertension. The Philippine Council for Health Research and Development (PCHRD) develop technology for a sambong herbal medicine tablet. Sambong is an aromatic shrub, that grows from 1 to 4 meters in height. It is considered as a weed in some countries and is difficult to eradicate. Sambong has yellow flowering heads that is 6 mm long. Sambong leaves are green obloid that spreads in a pyramidial pattern. Sambong bears fruits that are ribbed and hairy on top. Sambong fruit has 1 seed.

Sambong in Traditional and Folkloric Medicine

- Sambong roots and leaves are used as herbal treatment for fevers, sambong leaves and roots are pounded then dissolved in cold water. Applied with a soft cloth over the nape, forehead, underarms and other body parts to bring down the body temperature.
- Sambong roots and leaves are also used as herbal medicine treatment for rheumatism. Sambong roots and leaves are pounded and applied as poultice on the affected body part. Sambong roots and leaves may also be boiled and are applied as warm compress onto affected area
- Sambong is also used to treat headache, sambong leaves are pounded and applied as a poultice over the forehead.
- Sambong tea are also used as herbal medicine for colds and coughs.
- Sambong tea are also used for herbal

treatment of diarrhea and stomach spasms.

• Sambong juice are also used for treatment of cuts and wounds.



Sambong Antibacterial Antifungi: A and Phytochemical study indicates that sambong leaves contains chemicals icthyothereol acetate, cyptomeridiol, lutein and ß-carotene that has been found to have positive activity against microbes such as A niger, mentagrophytes and C albicans. Results also

showed activity against P aeruginosa, S aureus, B subtilis and E coli

- gather fresh sambong leaves, cut in small pieces
- wash with fresh water
- boil 50 grams of sambong leaves to a liter of water
- let it seep for 10 minutes
 - remove from heatdrink while warm
- 4 glasses a day for best results. Sambong poultice
- gather fresh leaves and roots
- wash with fresh clean water
- pound in a mortargrounded leavesmay be applied or a juice



New jail facility inaugurates in Imus



A new Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP) facility building, which can host hundreds of inmates, was inaugurated by officials on Monday, April 22, in a simple ceremony at the Cavite Civic Center in Barangay Palico IV in Imus City.

The BJMP jail facilities, considered as one of the most modern in the country, stands

on a 1,920-square meter lot at the Civic Center area, also called Land Transportation Office (LTO) compound.

Imus City Engineer Christian Sarno said that the jails at the five-story building can accommodate between 800 and 900 inmates and even more.

The jail building, built at a cost of P32-million, will also house

some offices and quarters of jail officers and personnel. It was the national government that funded the construction of the facility.

Overcrowding of detainees in cells has been a problem in Imus for years. The less than 100-square meter city jail has about 120 detainees which area can accommodate only between 40 and 60 detainees.###
