MANILA -- Senator Joel Villanueva on Monday urged the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) to monitor the existence

DTI URGED TO MONITOR EXISTENCE OF 'CHINESE-ONLY' ESTABLISHMENTS



of establishments and businesses that only cater to Chinese nationals and prohibit Filipinos from entering their premises.

Villanueva, chair of the Senate committee on labor, employment, and human resources development, said the DTI should also ensure that all establishments adhere

to the prevailing laws and regulations in the country.

"All establishments whether MSMEs (micro, small, and medium enterprises) or large corporations, must comply with our laws on nationality, such as the Retail Trade Law and the MSME Law," Villanueva told reporters in a text

message.

Senator Aquilino Pimentel III, meanwhile, said these Chinese-only establishments must be closed down for discriminating against Filipinos, which he said is a violation of the Constitution.

The Bill of Rights in the 1987 Constitution

guarantees protection for every Filipino.

"Business firms operating in the Philippines are not allowed to discriminate. Limiting customers to Chinese people only is a form of discrimination," Pimentel said.

Pimentel stressed that

the law must be enforced evenly.

"If Filipino-owned business establishments are not allowed to do this, then all the more foreign-owned businesses here in the Philippines should not be allowed to do what Filipinos cannot do under the law," Pimentel said.

"This form of

discrimination, it is directed against the Filipino. The Filipino is the victim of the discrimination," he added.

A restaurant called China Food City in Alabang has received online backlash after it supposedly barred Filipinos from entering its premises. (PNA)

Job seekers swarm GenTri Job Fair 2019

GENERAL TRIAS CITY, Cavite - Hundreds of job seekers trooped on Thursday to the Robinson's Place activity center in Barangay Tejero here for a post-Labor Day Job Fair organized by the city government.

In an interview with PNA, GenTri Public Employment Service Office (PESO) head Ariel Mugol said the "My Ony and Only Job Fair" was organized to extend as much assistance as possible to those seeking domestic and overseas employment.

"Ang Job Fair na ito ay para sa mga kakabayan natin dito sa Lungsod ng GenTri, upang tayo po mabigyan

ng mas magandang job opportunity sa mga nangangailangan ng trabaho dito sa bansa at sa abroad (this Job Fair is meant for our GenTri City constituents, to offer them more opportunities especially on those seeking for jobs here and abroad)," Mugol said.

He said around 35 local companies and 10 overseas agencies joined this year's job caravan, that targets residents not only of GenTri but also of nearby communities.

The job fair has also drawn the participation of government agencies like SSS, Phil Health, Philippine Statistic Agency (PSA) and Pag-Ibig Fund, ready to

facilitate the documentary requirements of applicants.

According to Mugol, the PESO and the city government also conducted free livelihood and skills training program in cooperation with the local social welfare and development office.

GenTri PESO's job training program in partnership with Job Start Philippines has enlisted the first batch of 100 enrollees for the 10-day training program which will commence on May 6 and culminate on May 20.

"The training aims to equip the participants with skills and technics on the preparation of formal resumé or curriculum



vite and the techniques on applying for a job," Mugol said.

The trainees will

also receive a PHP 200 allowance as well as free meals. All graduates in the training program

have been guaranteed employment by two companies based in this city. (PNA)

Customers of west zone concessionaire Manila will have to suffer a two-week supply break amid the quality of water in Laguna Lake.

In an announcement issued yesterday, the water firm said parts of Parañaque, Las Piñas, Muntinlupa and Cavite would have low pressure to no water supply until May 14.

This is commensurate

to around 170,000 water service connections.

"We have supply constraints because of the proliferation of algae in Laguna Lake. Increased algae in raw water require additional cleaning of our treatment plant filters, and this affects our level of production," Maynilad spokesperson Jennifer Rufo said.

The algae reproduction was perceived in the lake on April 23 due to the warmer temperature brought by El Niño.

In Imus, Cavite, interruptions will be expected in Barangays Anabu I-A to I-F, Bayan Luma I to IX, Bucandala I to V, Carsadang Bago I to II, Malagasang I-A to I-D, Malagasang I-G, Malagasang II-C to II-G, Poblacion I-A to I-C, Poblacion II-A, Poblacion III-A to III-B, Poblacion IV-A to IV-D, Tandang Luma I to VI, Tociong I-A to I-C and Pasong Buaya II.

For Bacoor, Barangays Molino II to VII, Queens Row Central, Queens Row East, Queens Row West, and San Nicolas III are affected.

In his introduction video posted on the Mr Gay World 2019 Youtube channel, Carlos said mental health awareness was one of his main advocacies, particularly the fight against depression.

"Depression is real, and it has caused the tragic loss of lives. Depression is a real illness that can be treated if properly diagnosed," he said.

"With love and understanding of people undergoing depression, this illness can be transformed into wellness."

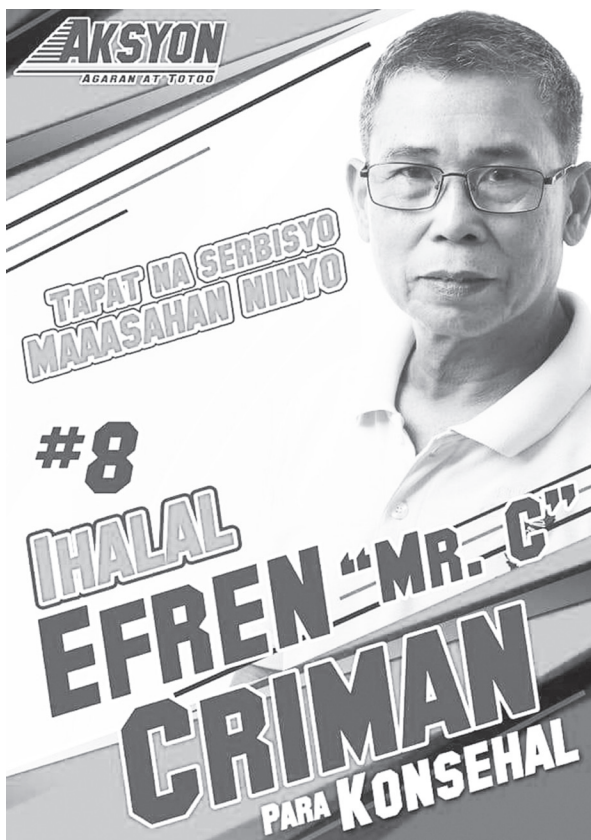

Metro Pacific core profit hits P3.66-B in Q1

Infrastructure conglomerate Metro Pacific Investments Corp. (MPIC) said on Thursday that its first-quarter core net income ended little changed compared to the same period last year, driven by expansion across its businesses.

In a press briefing, MPIC President and Chief Executive Officer Jose Ma. Lim said its consolidated core net income reached PHP3.660 billion in January to March from PHP3.646 billion last year.

Lim pointed out that all businesses "performed quite well" during the

quarter, but the toll roads unit incurred flat core net income due to the interest burden for funding new road projects.

He said earnings were sustained by an 8-percent increase in operating contribution driven by substantial core net income growth from Manila Electric Company (Meralco), the continuing volume growth coupled with inflation-linked and basic tariff increases at Maynilad Water Service Inc., and strong patient census at hospitals.

"All of which combined to offset higher interest costs," he added.

Power accounted for PHP2.7 billion or 54 percent of net operating income; toll roads shared PHP1.1 billion or 23 percent; water, PHP900 million or 18 percent; the hospitals group, PHP242 million or 5 percent; and the rail, logistics and systems group shared PHP7 million.

"Our 8-percent growth in contribution from operations reflects meaningful volume increases for most of our businesses following years of high investment and our continuing emphasis on operational efficiencies," he added.

Its construction is ongoing for the North Luzon Expressway (NLEX), Radial Road 10, Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX) C5 South Link, Cebu Cordova Link Expressway, and the Laguna section of the Cavite-Laguna Expressway.

"The rise in our borrowing costs has largely offset the increased operating contribution as we continue to make significant investments in our new road, water, energy and logistics projects. These will take some time to complete and begin contributing

to earnings," Lim added. (gocavite)

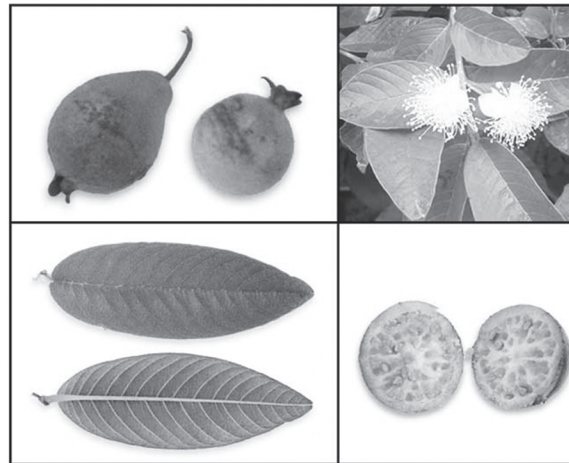

WHAT is Bayabas (Psidium guajava)?



Bayabas or guava fruit is known for being rich in vitamin C and vitamin A. It has value in herbal medicine for its antiseptic activity in treating wounds, ulcers, bacterial infections and diarrhea. Bayabas contains various compounds that provides bariious health benefits for man and this article will examine these claims as referenced to scientific studies.

Bayabas or guava is a fruit bearing shrub or small tree that grows in the tropical climate like Mexico, Peru and the Philippines. Bayabas is widely used in the Philippines as herbal medicine and is recognized by the Philippine Department of Health for its antiseptic property.

Bayabas leaves and fruits contain eugenol, tannin, saponins, amygdalin, phenolic acids, malic acid, ash, aldehydes, catequinic components and flavonoids. Bayabas or guava is used in herbal medicine as antiseptic, anti-inflammatory, antispasmodic, antioxidant, hepatoprotective, anti-allergy, antimicrobial, anti-plasmodial, anticough, antidiabetic, and antigenotoxic.

Bayabas or guava tree grows 3 to 10 meters tall with greenish to reddish-brown smooth bark. Bayabas produce a round globular bayabas fruit that starts as a flower. The

bayabas fruit is green and turns yellowishgreen and soft when ripe. Bayabas fruit has many small hard seeds contained in a yellowish pulp. Bayabas fruit is usually eaten while still green and hard.

Bayabas is traditionally used as antiseptic and antiinflammatory for skin conditions such as: skin burns, scalds, scrapes, sunburn wounds, psoriasis, eczema and others.

Crushed bayabas leaf or boiled leaves is applied directly to the affected skin, providing relief and believed to improve healing.

Bayabas is traditionally used to treat stomach problems diarrhea, dusertery, flatulence. A

decoction of bayabas leaves is taken 3-5 glasses per day.

Other health benefits of bayabas or guava in herbal medicine include antispasmodic, antioxidant, hepatoprotective, anti-allergy, antimicrobial, anti-plasmodial, anticough, antidiabetic, and antigenotoxic.

Renal protective effects of extracts from guava fruit (Psidium guajava L.) in diabetic mice.

This study analyzed the content of phenolic acids and flavonoids in extracts of guava fruit and examined the renal protective effects of guava extract in diabetic mice.

The findings support that guava fruit could protect kidney against diabetic progression via its anti-oxidative, antiinflammatory and antiglycative effects.

Anti-hyperglycaemic (Diabetic) potential of Psidium guajava raw fruit peel.

This study was undertaken to evaluate the glycaemic potential of Psidium guajava unripe fruit peel extract on blood glucose level of normal and streptozotocin induced diabetic rats. Results had shown guava extract lowered the fasting blood glucose to a considerable degree suggesting the hypoglycaemic as well as antidiabetic effect of guava extract in diabetic rats.

Antioxidative activities of Psidium guajava Linn leaves extracts

A study conducted to determine the antioxidative activities of the extracts from Psidium guajava Linn leaves showed that it has effects on scavenging hydroxyl radicals and inhibiting lipid peroxidation in the dosedependent manner. The guava extracts possess the potential antioxidative activities and the flavonoids may be one of their antioxidative components.

Antimicrobial effects of psidium guajava extract as one mechanism of its antidiarrhoeal action.

The objective for this study was to verify if the reported modes of the antidiarrhoeal action should be broadened to include direct antimicrobial actions on some of the more common bacteria known to cause toxin-induced acute diarrhoea. 10 organisms grown separately on nutrient agar plates were subjected to guava water extract and results have shown that the growth of all these organisms was inhibited suggesting the antidiarrhoeal activity.

respectively, overcame the Lower Chamber. The bills were mainly authored by Cavite Rep. Jennifer Austria-Barzaga.

The measure endeavors to set Barangay Victoria Reyes and Barangay New Era as separate barangays and entitle them to the appropriate Internal Revenue Allotment (IRA) share.

House Bill 9044 creates Barangay New Era in Dasmariñas City, Cavite. It provides that the plebiscite conducted and supervised by the Comelec pursuant to Provincial Ordinance No. 4 S91 of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan of the province of Cavite, which approved the creation of Barangay New Era as proclaimed by the Plebiscite Board of Canvassers shall serve as

a substantial compliance with the plebiscite requirement under Section 10 of Republic Act 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended.

The bills also entitle Barangays Victoria Reyes and New Era to IRA shares pursuant to Section 285 of

Local Government Code of 1991, as amended.

Currently, Barangay Victoria Reyes, formerly Pag-asa, has a population of 14,248, while Barangay New Era, formerly Sampaloc V, has a population of 3,224 based on the 2015 national census.(gocavite)
