Tagaytay, 10 Cavite towns now drug cleared towns are still striving

IMUS CITY, Cavite -- Tagaytay City and 10 other Cavite towns are among local government units (LGUs) that have been cleared of illegal drugs since the provincial police office has pursued its campaign against drugs, an official said Thursday.

In a report, Col. William Segun, Cavite Provincial Police Director, said 11 of the 23 Cavite towns and cities made their way to the list.

"We are still in the process and continue

to conduct operations against illegal drugs in our province. I have day-to-day monitoring on each police station," Segun said in an interview.

The 10 towns include Naic, Alfonso, Indang, Amadeo, Bailen, Magallanes, Maragondon, Mendez, Ternate and Noveleta.

Cavite City has only 36 out of its 84 barangays, while Rosario has seven out of 20 barangays that are cleared of the illegal drugs.

Segun said other towns are still striving to be drug-cleared, including Carmona where its eight villages have been 57.14 percent drug-free.

Cities of Bacoor, Cavite, Dasmariñas, General Trias, Imus and Trece Martires; while towns of Rosario, Silang, Tanza, Carmona, Kawit and General Mariano Alvarez (GMA) remain as drug-affected localities.

Based on the provincial police record, around 382 out of 829 barangays in the province are cleared of illegal drugs. (PNA)

Gardenia in Pampanga - a distribution gateway to the North Luzon region

Mabalacat, Pampanga - Gardenia president Jun Umali highly assures Gardenia is bringing the future of breadmaking here in Central Luzon and excited to embrace the limitless possibilities in the North Luzon region as they officially open a completely new and automated bread plant in Pampanga.

Gardenia Bakeries inaugurates a fully-automated bread manufacturing facility inside TECO industrial estate in Mabalacat, Pampanga strategically situated near two major expressways, the North Luzon Expressway (NLEX) and the Subic-Clark-Tarlac Expressway (SCTEX). It offers an efficient trade and distribution gateway to the North Luzon region all the way to Ilocos and Cagayan Valley as well as Central Luzon provinces.

Umali explained the plant inauguration's theme 'Bake to the Future 2.0'. "For the first time in Gardenia's history in the Philippines, Gardenia Bakeries opens two huge factories with sophisticated technologies in a span of four months. This is truly a significant milestone for Gardenia in its 21 years in the Philippine bakery industry," Umali stresses.

He also described how Gardenia applied the best technologies on its new production line. "The whole plant is computer-controlled starting from the use of an upgraded concept in the ingredient handling and makeup systems, proofing, use of robotics in handling baking pans and a unique technology in the depanning process which promises to be gentle to the bread, completely untouched by human hands,"

Umali said.

"The use of tumbler to check all four sides of the loaf bread and the presence of tornado cleaner to ensure all baking pans are clean and free of crumbs were also incorporated in the process," Umali added.

The oven baking system will continue to use environment-friendly liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) like in the other Gardenia factories.

Umali highlighted, "all equipment, machines and baking technologies are sourced from the best baking equipment suppliers from all over the world including Germany, the Netherlands, Japan and the USA. We also added new equipment suppliers that will enhance the whole baking process."

"The expertise in making advanced equipment from different sources operates as one integrated and a fully automated system is a proprietary technical capability developed by Gardenia in its factories in Asia. This fusion of technology differentiates us from the competition," Umali asserted.

The sophisticated technology partnered with

a proprietary manufacturing process and combined with premium and finest ingredients all contribute to the freshly - baked aroma, softness and delicious taste of world class Gardenia breads Filipinos love.

Umali also shared that the plant is designed to allow consumers to visit and witness the modern baking process through a catwalk plant tour especially for consumers from North Luzon.

Wide array of high quality breads

Umali further noted that the new plant will be Gardenia's second largest facility, next to its Laguna plant. "This new factory has a white loaf production line, a flavored loaf line, a bun and pandesal line and a snack toast line. With these four new production lines, the Pampanga factory will be able to produce nearly 400,000 loaves and buns every day ready for delivery to supermarkets, groceries and convenience stores," he said.

Vitabread Food Products Inc handles bread manufacturing for the North and Central Luzon bread needs, and support Metro Manila markets;

while Gardenia Bakeries Philippines ensures the marketing and distribution of finished Gardenia products.

Tina Domondon, Vitabread General Manager, explained that wide selection of Gardenia products will be produced in the Pampanga bread facility, including white breads, health bread selections, flavored loaf offerings, buns or pandesal, and Neubake loaf and bread rolls.


Strategic bread factory location

The P 2-billion plant is located adjacent to major transportation hubs of Subic Sea Port, Clark International Airport and the newest business district, Clark Global City. Umali explained that the new [bread] plant is accessible for direct logistics connections, "All of our plants are strategically located. For instance, in case of breakdowns or natural disasters, our plant in Pampanga can supply Metro Manila up to South Luzon. Same is true for our bread factories in Cebu and Cagayan de Oro. Our Cagayan de Oro manufacturing facility can serve the Visayas market, or the Cebu plant can be a backup for the Mindanao plant, in case of unforeseen events."

Meanwhile, Domondon revealed current logistics and distribution capabilities, "Gardenia is reaching Benguet, Ifugao, Mountain Province, Isabela, Kalinga and as far as Cagayan. With Vitabread

in place, we will be able to reach even the smallest stores in these regions and nearby areas. Gardenia bread in every corner of the community, we will make it possible," she said.

When asked about the pollution effect of the coal-fired power plant where TECO is one and the recent home of Gardenia in Central Luzon, Umali explained prior entering into contract with TECO, Gardenia Philippines visited the entire area within the plant to inspect any leak of emission the plant might exposed . Fortunately TECO is a compliant of all the permits needed to operate particularly the ECC from the DENR. And their location is almost 2km away from the TECO plant compound.

Increased bread supply all over the country

"With the two new bread factories, the Mindanao and the North Luzon plants, Gardenia now has a combined capacity of producing more than 1.8 million loaves and buns per day, serving the bread requirements of Filipino consumers nationwide. The increased production capability and expanded operations require more extensive market saturation, new area penetration and wider distribution coverage to reach more Filipino consumers in the farthest north and farthest south of the Philippines," Umali explained.

Filipinos are now assured of increased and sufficient supply of freshly baked Gardenia products every day and especially during peak demand seasons like Christmas and New Year.

"As the market leader in the industry with more than 60% market share, we can contribute in ensuring food security and continuous supply of breads, not only during long weekends or when there are special occasions, but also even when there are typhoons, flooding or earthquakes," Umali asserted.

DOST Showcases Solutions to UN Sustainable Development Goals in Science Fair



This year's exhibit of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) in celebration of the 2019 National Science and Technology Week will be especially relevant as the country transitions into what has been termed as the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

Scheduled to be held on July 17 to 21, 2019 at the World Trade Center in Pasay City, the 2019 NSTW carries the theme "Enabling Technologies for Sustainable Development", and will showcase how science and technology is addressing the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) which aim to end global poverty, protect the planet, and ensure peace and prosperity for all.

There will be multiple displays put up by the different DOST agencies highlighting the S & T solutions for each of the 17 SDGs. The Regional Offices (ROs) booth, for example, will showcase three (3) of these goals, namely: No Poverty (SDG 1), Decent Work and Economic Growth (SDG 8), and Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions (SDG

For the No Poverty exhibit, DOST will show the Community Empowerment through Science and Technology (CEST) program has contributed to poverty alleviation in the countryside. To increase the public's awareness about the assistance of DOST to MSMEs and communities, success stories of beneficiaries assisted by the different DOST Regional Offices will be presented in dioramas. Maiority of those stories will focus on CEST beneficiaries especially the Best CEST Awardees. CEST products will also be on display, such as bags and candles from Barangay Poblacion, Muntinlupa City, a DOST-NCR-assisted community.

The Decent Work

exhibit will focus on making micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) SMARTER Socially Responsive, Market-Oriented, Agile, Resource-Efficient, Technology-Intensive, Environment Friendly, and Resilient - through the Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program (SETUP) 2.0, with technology demonstrations featuring equipment of SETUP beneficiaries such as CNC laser marking machine, 3D printing machine and form fill seal machine. The concept will show how DOST's SET-UP helps in increasing the capability and productivity of MSMEs and subsequently contribute to the country's economic growth.

Lastly, the Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions booth will highlight the S&T initiatives in Marawi's Rehabilitation such as livelihood and innovation system support projects, scholarship, and complementary feeding programs for Maranaos who have been displaced by the Marawi Conflict. These are but a few of the DOST assistance that helped the affected residents to start their lives anew.

The Regional Offices' exhibit will also have a Gamezone area featuring interactive activities for kids, an Innovation Lounge to provide a venue for sharing of innovation best practices, training series, and technical consultancies, a Wellness Garden introducing the vertical helophyte technology used in water filtration and a Souvenir Shoppe by OneStore where visitors can buy souvenir items produced by DOST beneficiaries.

NSTW is celebrated every third week of July by virtue of Proclamation No. 169 of 1993, to highlight the significant contributions of science and technology to national development. It has also become a platform for heralding S&T advocacy in the country.

As in previous years, DOST-NCR has taken the lead role in the execution of the ROs exhibit booth.

Admission to the 2019 NSTW is free and the exhibits will be open from 1PM to 6PM on July 17, and 8AM to 6PM on July 18-21. 
