MANILA -- The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) is seeking an initial PHP200 million PHP300-million revolving fund for the implementation next year

of a new law supporting the innovation activities especially of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) and enable them to become part of the global market.

DTI Secretary Ramon Lopez said the law, the Philippine Innovation Act, provides a revolving grants fund of PHP1 billion sourced from the General Appropriations Act (GAA), and will be administered by the National Innovation Council (NIC).

"We are making an appeal to Congress, the Senate as we deliberate on the budget to include this part (revolving fund)

that is included in the law but was not included yet (in the budget) kasi halos sabay, bagong labas yung law at the same time nagde deliberate na sa budget for 2020 (the new law was just recently signed while the 2020 budget is being deliberated)," he told reporters Monday on the sidelines of inclusive innovation conference.

Lopez said the amount will be used to support industries that shift into digital transformation, and businesses undertaking innovation activities.

He pointed the law declares innovation as a vital component

of national development and sustainable economic growth.

The Trade chief further said the implementing rules and regulations (IRR) for the Philippine Innovation Act, as well as of the Innovative Startup Act, another landmark law on innovation, are currently being formulated and are expected to be out by next month.

Meanwhile, Lopez also bared they are looking for the establishment startup ecozones of nationwide as provided by the Innovative

> Startup Act. "Right now, we

are looking at ecozones for startups, not the usual PEZA (Philippine Economic Zone Authority) ecozone... it could still be under BOI (Board of Investments) but could be separate kasi (because) this is under the law," he said.

The law also creates under each lead host agency a startup grant fund to provide initial and supplemental grants-inaid for startups/ startup enablers. It also calls for the creation of startup

The DTI, Department of Science and Technology

(DOST), and Department of Information and $C\ o\ m\ m\ u\ n\ i\ c\ a\ t\ i\ o\ n\ s$ Technology (DICT) are lead host agencies to promulgate appropriate policies and guidelines for the coordinated implementation of the program.

"It can be a coworking space type, as long as the other enablers and support, digital infrastructures, internet are there to support their operations (to) lower their cost. Practically, those are the usual needs (of startups)," Lopez added. (PNA)

The criteria of the selection process include the following:

- Wholesome OFW Family (50%)

To qualify, nominees should comply with the following requirements:

- The OFW, either single or married and with proof of OWWA membership. should head the family & may be presently employed overseas or former OFW;
- The OFW should have at least 4 years of work experience abroad; that he/she has returned to the country for good for no longer than 10 years of the time of nomination;
- The OFW family is known as a solid/stable family in the locality;
- The OFW family should be financially stable; and
- The OFW family is actively involved in community projects.

Sen. Revilla to DBM: Find funds for gov't

Committee Civil on Service, Government Reorganization and Professional Regulation Tuesday explored possibilities of implementing salarv increase for government workers, especially rank and file employees who are in "financial trouble."

Led by Committee Chairman Sen. Bong Revilla, the public hearing focused on Salary Standardization Law V, Salary Increase and Granting of Additional Benefits for Teachers.

In his opening statement, Sen. Revilla said

the urgent need to implement a viable and fair salary increase for all government employees to help augment their source of income and provide a decent living for their families.

He ordered representatives of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) to find funds to implement the said increase.

He also emphasized that the "green light" for the salary increase was given by no less than Pres. Rodrigo Duterte during his 4th State of the Nation Address last July 22.

During the hearing, invited panellists hailing from Civil Service Commission (CSC), Department of Budget and Management (DBM), as well as various government and labor sectors and groups,

raised their personal concerns surrounding the implementation of salary increase for gov't workers.

It was revealed that some government employees are forced to pawn their ATM cards as collateral for loans. Other employees even face the trouble of being arrested because of their failure to pay their loans on time.

Sen. Bong Revilla stressed the importance of

the salary increase for gov't workers so that they will no longer fall prey into loan sharks and other lenders who would pressure them if they fail to follow their payment schedule.

He also asked all concerned parties to submit their position paper, and confirmed that he will create a technical working committee to scrutinize the matter.##


