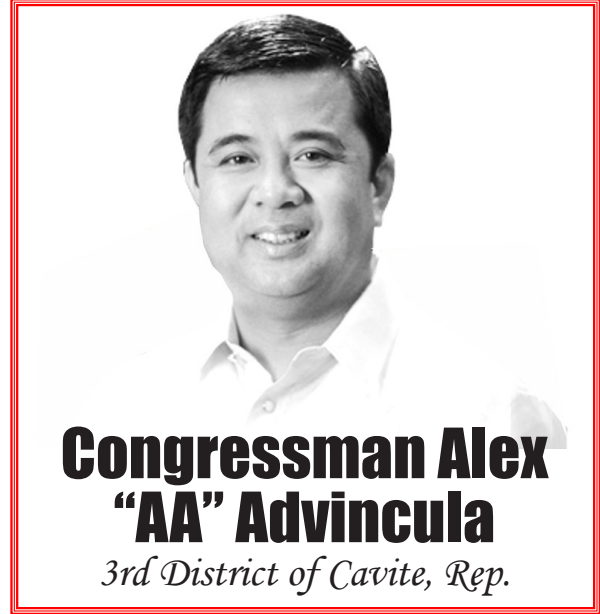

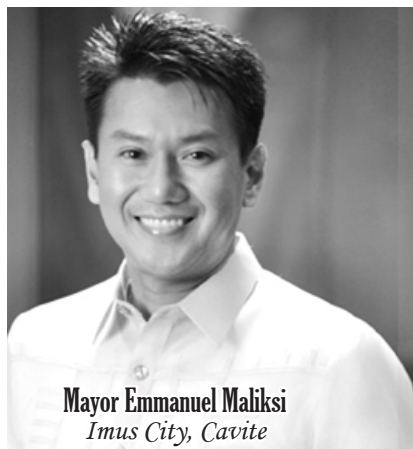

Industry Region 4-A, in partnership with the Philippine Center for Entrepreneurship-Go Negosyo, kicked off its KAPATID Mentor ME (KMME) - Money and Market Encounter (MME) Program on August 20, 2020 via Zoom with 47 mentees in the provinces of Laguna, Batangas, and Rizal

To survive and thrive amid the COVID-19 pandemic, a blended KMME-MME program for the New Normal is developed as a practical delivery mechanism for the same mentorship modules for the micro, small, and medium enterprises. The program addresses the urgent need for the continued access of mentees to Money, Market, and Mentorship (3Ms). This will be achieved through the presentation of the Business Improvement Plan (BIP) to an expanded panel of evaluators composed of representatives from banks, online market platforms, and other business support organizations.

During her

Welcome Remarks, DTI CALABARZON Assistant Director Marissa Argente mentioned that the program will have business experts, who also have their own businesses, to provide practical teachings for the mentees, at the same time, for the mentees to enjoy the whole learning experience.

ORDER

Acting on the petitioner’s Motion for Reconsideration, dated January 17, 2020, to the Order of the Court, dated January 6, 2020, dismissing this case without prejudice for failure of the petitioner, through counsel, to prosecute this case for an unreasonable length of time, which was timely filed. There being no objection from the Public Prosecutor and for the reasons stated therein, the Court is inclined to grant and hereby GRANTS the petitioner’s motion.

With respect to her Ex-Parte Motion with Leave of Court to Serve Service of Summons by Publication and for Issuance of Alias Summons, the Court GRANTS the same on the following grounds:

1. Based on the Sheriff’s Return, dated January 4, 2019, which was apparently submitted to the Court on September 10, 2019, the summons upon the respondent was unserved because the premises was always locked and the respondent is no longer residing for almost six months therein, as per information of the occupant of the adjacent room.

2. Section 15, Rule 14 of the Rules of Court; and Section 6 of AM No. 02-11-10-SC provide for such service of summons by publication.

WHEREFORE, the Clerk of Court is directed to issue the corresponding summons in this case. Let this Order, the summons together with the Petition, be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the Philippines, as may be chosen by raffle. The respondent is given a period of thirty (30) days from the last issue of publication within which to register his Answer to the Petition.

PETITION

PETITIONER, by counsel and unto the Honorable Court most respectfully files this petition for Declaration of Nullity of Marriage and in support thereof of further avers:

PREFATORY STATEMENT

*A valid marriage is essential in order to create the relation of husband and wife and to give rise to the mutual rights, duties and liabilities arising out of such relation. The law prescribes the requisites of a valid marriage. Hence, the validity of a marriage is tested according to the law in force at the time the marriage is contracted.*

NATURE OF THE CASE

This is a petition of Declaration of Nullity of Marriage on the ground of lack of capacity of the contracting parties to get married under Article 35 paragraph (1) of the Family Code as petitioner at the

time of her marriage in 1995 after the effectivity of the Family Code was below eighteen (18) years of age, thus making her marriage with respondent void ab initio.

PARTIES

1. Petitioner **LORENA M. LABAJO**, is of legal age, Filipino and presently residing at B37 L2 P1 Green Estate Subdivision, Malagasang 16, Imus City, Cavite where she may be served with summons and other processes of this Honorable Court while respondent **RICARDO J. GABRINAO**, of legal age, Filipino whose last known address was at No. 10 Husanna St. Brgy. San Martin De Porres Cubao, Quezon City where he may be served with summons, notices and other processes of the Honorable Court respectively.

MATERIAL FACTS

1. Petitioner met the respondent in 1994 in a canteen in Caloocan City where she was working as a waitress at the time while respondent was likewise working as a cook.

2. Eventually respondent courted the petitioner and two (2) months thereafter they became sweethearts.

3. Things happened so fast which was likened to a whirlwind relationship that six (6) months from the time they became sweethearts they eventually married each other on March 28, 1995 at the Metropolitan Trial Court of Metro Manila, Hall of Justice, Quezon City, before Hon. Mariano M. Singson, Jr. copy of their Marriage Contract is hereto attached as **Annex “A”** for ready reference;

4. At the time of their wedding on March 28, 1995, petitioner then was a minor, as she was just seventeen (17) years of age, as she was born only on April 2, 1978. Copy of her Certificate of Live Birth is hereto attached as **Annex “B”** for ready reference;

5. They begot a son by the name **BEJIE LABAJO GABRIANO**, who was born on January 18, 1996. Copy of his Certificate of Live Birth is hereto attached as **Annex “C”** for ready reference.

6. Their relationship was just short lived then as respondent was a grossly irresponsible person and a happy go lucky guy who never had the intention of supporting herein petitioner and their son. He never had a permanent job and would always be out with his friends on a drinking spree that was why they were always quarrelling with each other which led to both parties to part ways. Thus, on November 1998, the parties separated from each other and petitioner went on to singly support their son and worked alone to sustain their needs.

7. Since then, parties never saw and had communicated with each other anymore up to present. The last that petitioner heard of the whereabouts of the respondent was that he has his own family already.

8. Parties likewise never acquired property, real or personal or any business transaction, corporation or any form of monetary relations when they were still living together.

9. Obviously, the marriage of the parties was non-existent/void from the beginning as petitioner at the time of their wedding, was a minor. Petitioner was just seventeen (17) years old only when they contracted their marriage on March 25, 1995, which was also celebrated after the effectivity of the Family Code of the Philippines in 1988, where under the said law that the marrying age/legal age is fixed at eighteen (18) years of age pursuant to Article 35 of the said law to wit;

“Chapter 3. Void and Voidable Marriages

Art. 35. The following marriages shall be void from the beginning:

(1) Those contracted by any party below eighteen years of age even with the consent of parents or guardians;

(2) Xxxxxx;

10. Evidently, at the time of their marriage, petitioner lacks the legal capacity to enter into a contract of marriage which is one of the essential requisites of marriage and thus making their marriage invalid and non-existent/void ab initio from the start pursuant to Article 2 in relation to Article 4 of the Family Code to wit:

“Chapter 1. Requisites of Marriage

Art. 2. No marriage shall be valid, unless these essential requisites are present:

(1) Legal capacity of the contracting parties who must be a male and a female; and

(2) Consent freely given in the presence of the solemnizing offer. (53a)

Xxxxxxxxxxxx

Art. 4. The absence of any of the essential or formal requisites shall render the marriage void ab initio, except as stated in Article 35 (2).

Xxxxxxxxxxxx

11. Thus, to deliver both petitioner and respondent from the ordeals of a non-existent marriage that only proved to be a farce from the start and which had brought them nothing but pain and grief and thus to free them from eternal embarrassment and inequity of being bound by such invalid marriage, said marriage should be declared void ab initio.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, it is most respectfully prayed of this Honorable Court to:

a. Declare petitioner and respondent’s marriage on March 28, 1995 to be void ab initio as it was

non-existent from the start in view of the minority of the petitioner at the time of its celebration in accordance with Article 35 par. (1) of the Family Code;

b. Order and or direct the Local Civil Registrar of Quezon City, Metro Manila and the Philippines Statistic Authority to delete and expunge from their respective marriage registers the entry of marriage between the parties and such other documents pertaining thereto.

Other reliefs just and equitable under the premises are likewise prayer for.

## OFFICIAL STATEMENT

### PhilHealth denies cover up in Region 1 leak incident; remains committed to cooperate in all investigations by authorities

**T**he Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) assures the public that there is no truth to allegations of a cover up on the leak incident in its PhilHealth Region 1 Office in Dagupan City due to a heavy downpour on August 19, 2020.

As earlier reported, all the documents are intact and are all accounted for, and no critical equipment suffered damage from the incident.

The Philippine National Police, Bureau of Fire Protection, Criminal Investigation and Detection Group, and the National Bureau of Investigation have initially looked into the incident. The PRO I is also conducting parallel investigation and is now coordinating with the NBI to secure a copy of their own report to the Department of Justice.

Reports that circulated citing that the affected areas are the IT and Accounting Sections which

are both located at the ground floor are false. Footage that circulated showing the leaks affecting computers and printers was at the Benefit Administration Section which is located at the mezzanine.

PRO 1's IT personnel have acted swiftly to save the said equipment. Nevertheless, all electronic data are secured in its data centers owing to the electronic filing of claims.

As to the presence of NBI agents in the head office, the Agency fully understands their concern to protect essential documents needed by the Task Force PhilHealth in their investigation. PhilHealth assures them that these documents are intact and will be made available to them.

PhilHealth reiterates its commitment to fully cooperate with all the investigating authorities. It also appeals to everyone to refrain from speculating so as not to cause undue public concern.

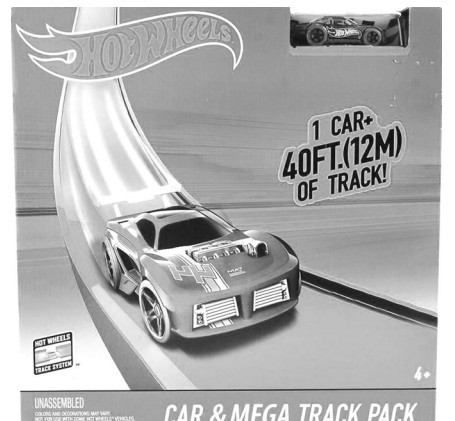

**Ladislao Diwa was the third and last Politico-Military Governor of Cavite during the Philippine Revolution. He first conceived the idea of establishing a secret society and brought it to the attention of Teodoro Plata and Andres Bonifacio. The three set up the Katipunan on July 7, 1892, the day that Rizal was exiled to Dapitan. He was working as clerk of Court in Pampanga when he was arrested by the Spaniards for propaganda work for the Katipunan. He was released in 1897 and he joined the forces of Gen. Mariano Trias. He was made a Colonel when he effected the surrender of the Spaniards in Malabon (Gen. Trias) in 1898. He was appointed as Politico-Military Governor of Cavite succeeding Emiliano Riego De Dios.**

# TESDA's TOTS project to benefit relocation site in Maragondon town

TRECE MARTIRES CITY, Cavite -- The Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA)-Cavite will launch the Turn-On-The-Sun (TOTS) project on August 28, 2020 in Maragondon town.

This is a five-day training for Basic Solar (off-grid) Lighting and Charging System for the benefit of the residents of Barangay Sta. Mercedes as well as identified personnel of the local National Police (PNP) and Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP). Said training will not only provide additional skills for the learners but also working solar lighting and charging system for their personal use.

TESDA, being the PRLEC (Poverty Reduction, Livelihood and Employment Cluster) Chair in the national

level, under the directive of President Rodrigo Duterte, aims to develop self-reliant, resilient and sustainable communities through harmonized and culturally responsive development programs.

The identified PRLEC priority barangay for the province of Cavite is Barangay Patungan which is now known as Barangay Sta. Mercedes in Maragondon, that was also a priority barangay under the National Intelligence Coordinating Agency (NICA) in 2019.

A land dispute between the residents and a private corporation caused the relocation of half of the residents with the relocation area lacking in electricity, thus the launching of TOTS project.

Likewise, partner agencies in the PRLEC, such

as Cooperative Development Authority (CDA), Department of Science and Technology (DOST), and the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) shall be providing training seminars for Cooperative organization and entrepreneurial skills, among others.

There will also be an awarding of the basic/starter tool kits from the previous training, Cut and Sew Leading to Dressmaking. About 20 participants of the training will also given sewing machines, sponsored by the Department of Labor and Employment. (PIA)
