# DPWH completes major repairs on 'Odette'-damaged infra

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) on Saturday reported the completion of major emergency works on roads and bridges in areas affected by Typhoon Odette in December 2021.

Secretary Roger Mercado said repair works were done within 15 days, with 47 national road sections cleared and reopened.

"The reopening of roads allowed the

national government, local government units, and NGOs (non-governmental organizations) to immediately extend relief efforts especially in hardly affected areas," he said in a statement.

Mercado and other DPWH officials inspected affected infrastructures in Cebu, Negros Oriental, Bohol, Southern Leyte, Surigao del Norte, and Dinagat Islands last week. "Southern Cebu

is again accessible to motorists as the regional offices worked round-the-clock for the immediate reopening of Sariling Bridge in Malabuyoc, Cebu," he added.

The Sariling Bridge approach along the national highway, connecting the town of Alegria in the north and Ginatilan to the south, collapsed after "Odette" made landfall in Cebu on Dec. 17, 2021.

## NTF data show 52.1M Filipinos already fully vaxxed

The Philippines has administered 112,745,559 doses of coronavirus vaccines nationwide, including second doses for 52,109,143 Filipinos.

The National Covid-19 dashboard on Saturday also showed that among the fully vaccinated, 3,082,514 already received booster doses as added protection against Covid-19.

On Friday, the

country also received this year's first shipment of the Covid-19 vaccine -- 150,540 doses of Moderna vaccine that completed government procurement 13 million doses.

Overall, 210,783,650 doses, both donated and purchased, have been delivered since February 2021.

Dr. Ted Herbosa, medical adviser of the

National Task Force Against Covid-19, welcomed 2022's initial shipment and urged those who are still unvaccinated to get their primary doses and the fully jabbed to avail of booster shots.

On Sunday, 2,703,870 doses of United-States donated Pfizer jabs will arrive at 2 p.m. while the lower-dosed vaccines meant for the pediatric population aged 5 to 11 are scheduled to be delivered middle of this month. (PNA)

## NEW LAW GIVING 'SMALL' FARMERS CASH ASSISTANCE UNTIL 2024 INKED



Small farmers tilling two hectares and below of rice land will get an annual direct cash assistance under a new law signed by President Rodrigo Duterte.

Duterte signed Republic Act (R.A.) No. 11598 also known as Cash Assistance for Filipino Farmers Act on Dec. 10, 2021. The copy of the law was released to reporters on Thursday.

In signing the law, Duterte recognized the policy of the State to address the plight of small farmers in the country.

"The State recognizes the urgency of intervening for our farmers in light of the current state of declining palay prices and the crippling effects of the Coronavirus Disease-19 or Covid-19 pandemic. Towards this end, the State shall provide monetary assistance to the hardest hit segments of the country's small farmers in the form of actual giving of cash to farmers," RA 11598 read.

RA 11598 authorizes the Department of Agriculture (DA) to use the monies from the annual tariff revenues in excess of PHP10 billion on the Rice Competitiveness Enhancement Fund (RCEF) to directly provide cash assistance to the small farmers until 2024.

The law mandates Bureau of Customs (BOC) to directly remit to the DA the said excess funds.

The BOC and the DA shall, at the end of each year, submit separate reports to Congress, through the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Food and Agrarian Reform and the House Committee on Agriculture and

Food, on the remittance of funds and the actual fund disbursement for the year.

The source of funds for the annual direct cash assistance to farmers shall be the excess of PHP10 billion of the annual tariff revenues from rice importation pursuant to RA No. 11203 or the Rice Tariffication Law (RTL).

RA 11203 removes government limits, called quantitative restrictions (QRs) on rice importation.

The Cash Assistance for Filipino Farmers Act was passed by the House of Representatives as House Bill No. 9950 on Sept. 15, 2021 and adopted by the Senate of the Philippines as an amendment to Senate Bill No. 1927 on Sept. 21, 2021. (PNA)

## LGUs urged to let people choose preferred Covid-19 vax brand

A party-list lawmaker on Wednesday urged local government units (LGUs) to let people choose their preferred Covid-19 vaccine brand for a booster shot.

Anakalusa Party-list Representative Mike Defensor said the LGUs should clearly indicate in their registration websites which vaccines are available for the Covid-19 booster dose.

He said the

Department of Health (DOH) has come out with guidelines on mix-and-match of primary jabs and booster shots and LGUs should adopt the agency's recommendations and be transparent in its registration process.

He particularly cited the case in Quezon City wherein its Vax Easy registration system does not show which brand of vaccine is offered in what vaccination center.

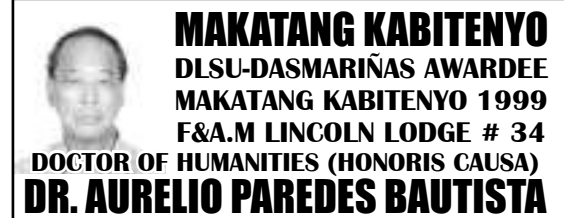
"All it shows are the inoculation centers and the number of slots still available, leaving the registrant to guess which booster to choose," he said.

He said the constituents fear that they would just waste their time by returning home if they do not like the vaccine when they go to their preferred vaccination site.

Defensor pointed out that based on the DOH mix-and-match guidelines, those who have received their primary shots have the option to choose Sinovac, AstraZeneca, Pfizer or Moderna as their booster. National Task Force (NTF) Against Covid-19 chief implementer, Secretary Carlito Galvez Jr., said the Philippines is "relatively" slow in administering booster shots against Covid-19.

The latest data from the NTF showed that the Philippines has administered 110,089,619 doses of Covid-19 vaccines nationwide -- 57,254,482 were given as first doses, 50,627,196 as second doses and 2,207,941 were utilized as booster shots.

"We are still relatively slow sa ating mga pagbo-booster. At the same time, kailangan po natin hanapin at i-vaccinate ang 2.5 million na unvaccinated seniors (We are still relatively slow in injecting booster shots. At the same time, we need to find and inoculate the 2.5 million unvaccinated seniors)," Galvez noted. (PNA)

## DPWH Targets to Open Bohol's Clarin Bridge by First Half of 2022



## CAVITE HIGHLIGHTS

**The Haciendas started as “ Sahud-Ulan” or agriculture that depended on rain. Later, the dams were constructed and irrigation was introduced. Consequently, the rents paid by tenants increased.**

A bridge project of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) that will serve an important role in the mobility of goods and people and provide greater access to the tourism sites of Bohol Province is targetted to open this first half of 2022.

In his project briefing to Secretary Roger G. Mercado, Undersecretary and Build Build Build Chief Implementer Emil K. Sadain reported that construction of new Clarin Bridge along the Bohol Circumferential Road is at 82 percent to date and is targeted to be completed before the term of President

Rodrigo Roa Duterte ends in June 2022.

The new 2-lane Clarin Bridge will replace the old bridge damaged during the Bohol earthquake in 2013.

Secretary Mercado together with Undersecretary Sadain, Region 7 Director Edgar Tabacon and other Department officials, had an actual visual impression of the project progress with an aerial inspection on January 5, 2022 in Loay, Bohol on-board military chopper while enroute to one of Typhoon “Odette’s” hardest-hit areas in the town of Trinidad for a meeting with

Bohol LGUs headed by Governor Arthur C. Yap and to hand-over DPWH assistance for the severely affected people of the province.

Undersecretary Sadain, in-charge of Unified Project Management Office (UPMO) Operations implementing large-scale infrastructure projects of the Department under Official Development Assistance (ODA), has instructed Ms. Rose Lao of contractor Vicente T. Lao Construction in partnership with Indonesia’s PT Wijaya Karya to expedite the construction of

approach roads of the main bridge.

Undersecretary Sadain also reminded that at this stage of pandemic slowing down construction activities and causing project critical delay, health and safety risk assessments of every worker needs to be conducted regularly consistent with medical and government guidelines, and contractors’ duty to provide a safe working environment.

According to UPMO Roads Management Cluster 1 Project Manager Francisco Sawali, the new bridge crossing

laminated sacks to affected provinces in the Visayas and Mindanao.

As of the latest report from the National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) on Thursday, the DSWD has delivered 799 rolls of laminated sacks to 7,990 family beneficiaries in the Caraga region.

On New Year's Day, 273 rolls of laminated sacks arrived in Cebu from the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), the main disaster hub of the DSWD. About 275 rolls came from the warehouse and were also delivered to Maasin, Southern Leyte.

Meanwhile, 460 family tents are in transit from Liloan Port going to Surigao, while 900 rolls of laminated sacks from DSWD 5 (Bicol) will be delivered to Cebu. About 600 rolls from DSWD 8 (Eastern Visayas) are likewise in transit to Cebu.

The department also procured 6,000 rolls of laminated sacks and 4,000 tarpaulin sheets that will benefit displaced families in affected areas.

Aside from shelter materials, the DSWD continues its

augmentation of food and non-food items to affected localities.

In Western Visayas, the DSWD field office released 5,950 family food packs (FFPs) to affected local government units in the southern part of Negros Occidental.

Likewise, the DSWD-8 provided additional 1,700 FFPs to San Ricardo, Southern Leyte, 1,600 FFPs to Pintuyan, Southern Leyte, 1,000 FFPs to Bato, Leyte and 800 FFPs to Mahaplag, Leyte.

In Caraga, 1,500 FFPs will be delivered to the local government units (LGUs) of Pilar, General Luna, Burgos, and Sta. Monica in Siargao Island. About 5,000 FFPs from the DSWD 12(Soccksargen) and 8,300 FFPs from the NRLMB are also in transit to Siargao Island.

As of 6 a.m., the department has provided more than PHP282 million worth of aid to affected families.

The DSWD pledged to continue to provide assistance to "Odette" victims, especially in the provision of resource augmentation to all affected cities and municipalities. (PR)

In Cebu, 500 bags of grocery items were distributed to the people of Malabuyoc and 500 packs of rice and goods to Alegria residents, while 750 food packs were taken to Negros Oriental.

From DPWH's "Operation Malasakit (Concern)" led by officials and employees,

cash assistance were given to Bohol, Cebu's 7th congressional district (Alcantara, Alegria, Badian, Dumanjug, Ginatilan, Malabuyoc, Moalboal, Ronda), Negros Oriental, Siargao, Dinagat Islands, and the island municipality of Limasawa, Southern Leyte. (PNA)

# Secretary Mercado Inspects Cebu's First Toll Expressway Project



Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) Secretary Roger G. Mercado declared that the Cebu-Cordova Link Expressway or CCLEX will soon strengthen the carrying capacity of the road network of Cebu Province.

In his inspection at the project over Mactan channel, Secretary Mercado commended the efforts of the local government units of Cebu City and Municipality of

Cordova which entered into Public-Private Partnership through an agreement with Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation to build the toll road that will drastically cut travel time to the Mactan Cebu International Airport from Cebu City and those coming from the south of Cebu Province

Secretary Mercado said that the benefits of the project will be realized soonest with the expressway, the


first outside Luzon, now on its last stage of completion.

Joining Secretary Mercado in the project visit in coordination with CCLEX Corporation President and General Manager Allan Alfon are DPWH Senior Undersecretary Rafael C. Yabut, Undersecretaries Maria Catalina E. Cabral and Eugenio R. Pipo Jr., Assistant Secretary Ador G. Canlas, Region 7 Director Edgar Tabacon, and District

Engineer Daisy Toledo. The approximately 8.9-kilometer CCLEX and sometimes referred as the Cebu - Cordova Bridge is a cable-stayed twin single pylon main bridge with span length of 390 meters.

The bridge project has a pylon height of 145 meters and navigational vertical clearance of 52.5 meters and 260 meters horizontal clearance.

With a carrying capacity of two (2) lanes per direction, the expressway project also involves the construction of 1,350 meters of viaduct and 5,219 meters causeway and 603 meters low-level bridges. (DPWH)

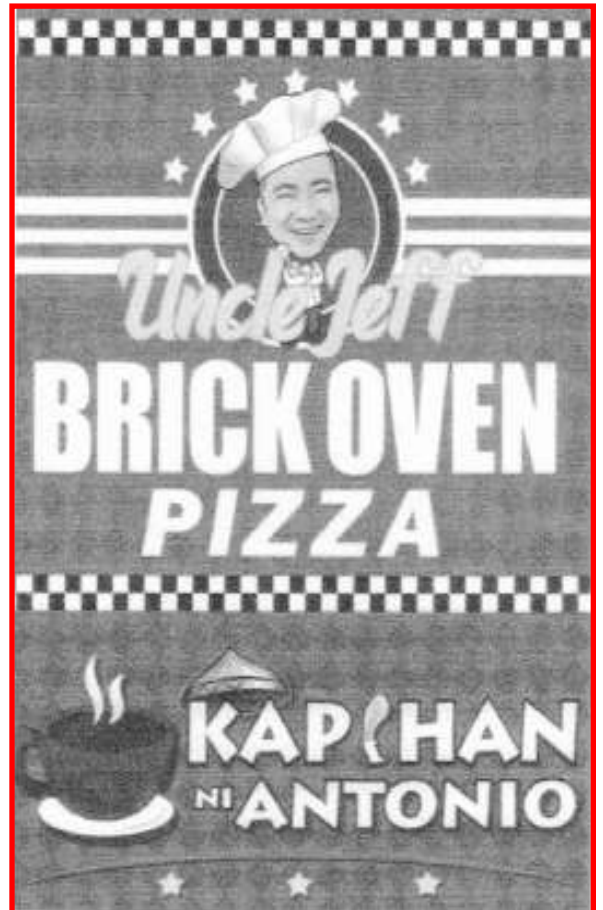
