PhilHealth set to accredit 500 YAKAP facilities in CALABARZON

In a bid to expand access to free medical consultations and medicines, the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) Calabarzon aims to accredit 500 healthcare facilities by the end of 2026, under its Yaman ng Kalusugan Program (YAKAP), bringing preventive healthcare services closer to residents across the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, and Quezon.

Dr. Edwin Orina, Acting Vice President of PhilHealth Region IV-A, said the region currently has 289

accredited YAKAP Clinics providing healthcare services to members. Despite the number, the facilities remain insufficient for nearly 11 million residents of the three provinces. “Dito po sa Region IV-A [mayroong] at least 289 YAKAP providers. I assure you po, kulang po yung 289, kasi napa-kalaki po ng ating tatlong probinsya – Cavite, Laguna, and Quezon. At the same time, we have at least 10-11 million population, so maliit po yung 289,” Dr. Orina stated during an interview with the Philippine Information Agency. He added that the PhilHealth aims to establish 500 YAKAP Clinics across the region and expand the number of Guaranteed and Accessi-

ble Medications for Out-patient Treatment (GAMOT) providers to serve more Filipinos, particularly its members, and ensure wider access to healthcare services, benefits, free medical care, and medicines. “We’ve targeted na at least 500 YAKAP facilities ang makumpleto namin, ma-share together with the 289, and also we have at least 221 GAMOT Providers, so sabihin natin, konti pa rin yan kase remember yung YAKAP Provider tapos kukuha ka ng gamot dun sa 54 medicines, kailangan mo yung malapit din sayo na GAMOT Provider para hindi ka ba-biyahe ng malayo o ng other provide to get it, so dapat taasan din natin yung mga GAMOT Providers natin,” Dr. Ori-

na said. PhilHealth has increased the consultation benefit under the YAKAP program to ₱1,700 per individual, for both public and private healthcare facilities. This is higher than the previous coverage to encourage greater utilization and improve access to affordable healthcare services. Dr. Orina then emphasized that the program is not only for individuals experiencing health concerns but also for those who wish to regularly monitor their health status and consult with accredited healthcare facilities under the program, promoting preventive care and early detection of potential health conditions. “Magpa-register kayo sa Philhealth pero

gamitin niyo po ang PhilHealth through YAKAP para mabantayan po ang kalusugan ninyo, because this is prevention rather than cure,” Orina stated. Meanwhile, additional services that PhilHealth members can avail themselves of through YAKAP are dental and optometric, reinforcing its preventive healthcare approach by helping detect health risks before they develop into serious conditions. The expansion of PhilHealth services is part of President Marcos administration’s directive to strengthen the country’s healthcare system by ensuring the delivery of more comprehensive, accessible, and inclusive health services for all Filipinos. 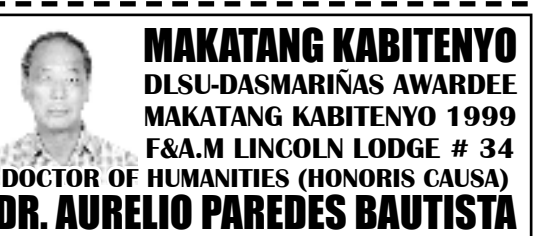

SSS Pension Booster delivers 6.2% return for members amid economic challenges



QUEZON CITY, 23 June 2026 – The Social Security System (SSS) announced that its Pension Booster Program, also known as the Voluntary Provident Fund, continues to deliver strong financial performance in 2026, posting an average return on investment (ROI) of 6.2 percent from January to May this year despite prevailing economic challenges.

The program remains a reliable retirement savings option for Filipino workers. While slightly lower than the previous year's performance due to changes in interest rates implemented by the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas, the return remains competitive and continues to exceed market benchmark rates.

Finance Secretary and Social Security Commission ex-officio Chair Frederick D. Go said the program reflects the government's commitment to strengthening retirement security.

"The continued strong performance of the SSS Pension Booster underscores our commitment to protecting the financial future of Filipino workers. Through prudent management of members'

funds, we are helping build a more secure and dignified retirement for every Filipino," Go said.

SSS noted that the 2026 performance follows the 6.83 percent return in 2025, surpassing the prevailing 91-day treasury bill rate which has a year-to-date average of approximately 4.77 percent.

In 2025, contributions rose to 21.8 percent to P699 million from P574 million in 2024, reflecting growing member confidence in the program.

To maximize members' earnings, SSS waived the one percent management fee on the total balance of Pension Booster accounts from 2025 to 2028, allowing members to fully enjoy investment gains.

SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph M. de Claro said the program reflects prudent investment management and long-term value creation. He added that members may now conveniently monitor the monthly compounding growth of their Pension Booster savings through their My.SSS accounts, allowing them to track the progress of their retirement funds and make more informed decisions

in planning for their future.

"The strong performance of the Pension Booster demonstrates disciplined and professionally managed savings. We remain committed to providing members greater financial security during retirement," de Claro said. The Pension Booster is open to all SSS members to build additional savings for their retirement. It allows individuals to save starting at P500, with no maximum contribution limit.

Contributions are pooled and invested in government securities, corporate bonds, fixed-income instruments, equities, and money market instruments, with tax-free earnings credited proportionately to members' accounts.

De Claro urged members to start early and stay invested longer to maximize returns, citing the benefits of compound growth. "Planning and saving for retirement should begin early. The longer the members stay invested, the greater their potential returns," he said. Interested SSS members may enroll in the Pension Booster Program online through their My.SSS account. #

Thirteen media practitioners from Northern Mindanao joined the second leg of the 2026 PANAGHIUSA: CARD MRI Exposure Tour Program from May 25 to 27, 2026, held at Cagayan de Oro City. The program aims to expose media practitioners to CARD Mutually Reinforcing Institutions (CARD MRI) programs, highlighting its efforts to eradicate poverty.

"CARD MRI's mission has always been anchored on its commitment to poverty eradication and finding ways to better serve our clients through products and services that truly respond to their needs," said CARD MRI Publishing House President Marilyn Magampon Manila. "We aim to work closely with like-minded media practitioners to help amplify this message and, in doing so, raise greater public awareness of the meaningful impact of microfinance in improving lives and communities," she added.

To provide them with a deeper understanding of how CARD MRI reaches and serves communities, participants were divided into two groups for the center meeting visits. They also had the taste of the traditional Filipino snacks, puto maya and sikwate, prepared by Nice Nanol, a CARD SME Bank client for more than 15 years.

The itinerary also included a storytelling session for children led by CARD MRI Publishing House, featuring its children's book Ang Lapis ni Anya. With 21 children in attendance, the activity promoted literacy and a love of reading, encouraging young learners to develop positive reading habits and reduce excessive screen time.

480 TRECEÑOS BENEFIT FROM PGC MEDICAL AND DENTAL MISSION

Residents of Brgy. Lapidario, Trece Martires City gained access to free healthcare services through a Medical and Dental Mission conducted by the Provincial Government of Cavite (PGC) on June 23, 2026.
