**Statement in Support of
Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth)**

The Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) industry in the country has resiliently been in existence for over four decades and counting. For the longest time it has been and continues to be an integral part of the country's health delivery systems.

The Association of Health Maintenance Organizations of the Philippines, Inc. (AHMOPI) is a recognized trade organization of HMOs in the country. Organized and registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission on November 13, 1987, it undertakes to protect the interest of the industry and all stakeholders of the business, its valued clients and plan holders in particular – the Filipino people.

Considering that all Filipinos are now PhilHealth members, **HMO benefits support PhilHealth benefits, PhilHealth being the "first payor" for the same.** HMOs complement PhilHealth benefits in terms of huge coverage limits on a per illness or injury per year basis, or aggregate benefit limit per year. This significantly reduces out-of-pocket expenses and essential drugs covered under coordinated UHC pathways.

The HMO industry and especially the AHMOPI is privileged to have PhilHealth as an invaluable partner in providing the Filipino people with accessible, affordable, and more importantly, preventive as well as life-saving medical interventions and treatment which result in favorable health outcomes. Under the leadership of its President and CEO, **Dr. Edwin M. Mercado, MHA, NMSC**, the AHMOPI firmly resolves to work hand-in-hand with PhilHealth, our accredited institutional healthcare providers and doctors nationwide, and the rest of our stakeholders in the industry -- to further enhance the Filipino people's well-being leading to a healthier nation.

The Association of Health Maintenance Organizations of the Philippines, Inc. (AHMOPI) has reaffirmed its support for the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth) and committed to strengthening collaboration with the state insurer to advance Universal Health Care and improve healthcare access for Filipinos.

The association said these enhancements have reinforced PhilHealth's role as the country's primary healthcare payor while providing

Filipinos with broader financial protection against medical expenses.

AHMOPI emphasized that HMOs complement these benefits by offering higher annual coverage limits and additional medical benefits that help reduce out-of-pocket healthcare expenses not fully covered by PhilHealth.

"Considering that all Filipinos are now PhilHealth members, HMO benefits support PhilHealth benefits, with PhilHealth serving as the first payor," the association said.

The association added that the coordinated role of PhilHealth and HMOs allows members to maximize available healthcare benefits while ensuring greater financial protection during medical treatment.

AHMOPI also underscored the HMO industry's long-standing role in the country's healthcare delivery system, noting that the sector has been serving Filipinos for more than four decades by working alongside hospitals, physicians and other healthcare providers to improve access to quality medical care.

The association said it considers PhilHealth an invaluable partner in delivering accessible, affordable, preventive and life-saving healthcare services to Filipinos.

Under the leadership of PhilHealth President and Chief Executive Officer Dr. Edwin M. Mercado, AHMOPI said it remains committed to working hand in hand with the state insurer, accredited healthcare institutions, medical professionals and other stakeholders to further strengthen healthcare delivery, enhance patient outcomes and help build a healthier nation.

What hard work grows

Growing up in Sta. Maria, Laguna, Teresita D. Dita early learned how to be self-reliant. Having completed only elementary education, she began earning a living by cooking and selling native delicacies in their town. Back then, she did this with her mother.

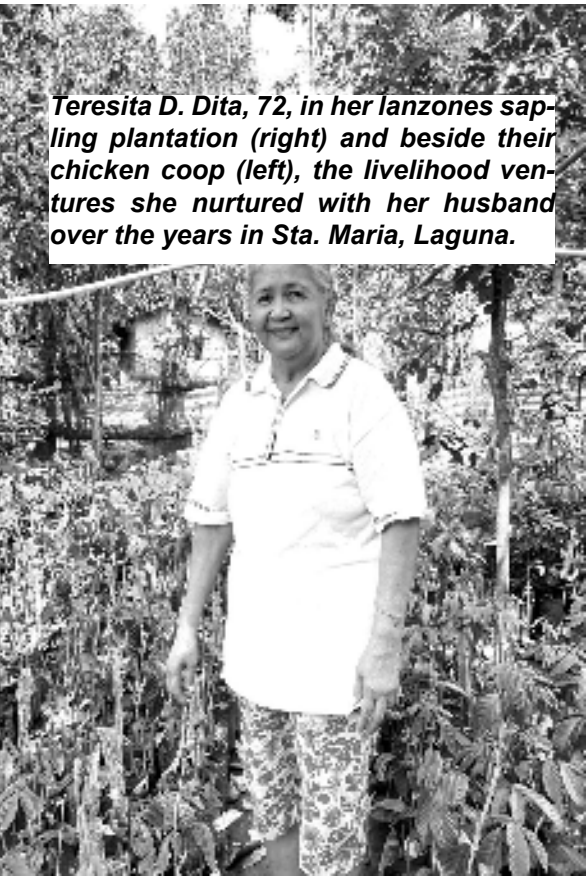
The taste of her delicacies became famil-

iar in their community, and her skill in preparing traditional delicacies also brought recognition to their town. Teresita's homemade sticky rice cake (suman) won twice during the Marilag Festival, an agricultural and cultural celebration in Sta. Maria, Laguna.

When she got married, Teresita's native del-

icacy business was not enough to support their six growing children. To make ends meet, she and her husband started another source of income by raising chickens and selling their eggs. It took them courage to invest their marriage fund to start this poultry business. The early days of raising chickens and

waiting for egg production were not easy. Another investment required to grow the business was making sure pests and viruses would not sicken them. With their continuous dedication, they are finally able to supply their town with trays of eggs ranging from PHP 280 to PHP 290 each. Along with Teresita's continued

SP holds public hearing on proposed ordinance strengthening anti-hazing measures in Cavite



In a move to reinforce the Province of Cavite's commitment to protecting students and promoting safe educational environments, the Sangguniang Panlalawigan conducted a public hearing on Proposed Ordinance No. 092-2026, which seeks to strengthen the implementation of Republic Act No. 11053 or the Anti-Hazing Act of 2018, on July 21, 2026, at the Conference Room of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan.

Authored by 4th District Board Member Nickanor N. Austria, Jr. and co-authored by 1st District Board Member Juan Ysmael R. Gandia and 2nd District Board Member Alde-Joselito F. Pagulayan, the proposed ordinance aims to establish stronger preventive measures,

monitoring mechanisms, and local coordination among educational institutions, local government units, and covered organizations to curb hazing incidents in the province.

The public hearing was presided over by BM Alde-Joselito F. Pagulayan, who underscored the significance of the initiative in strengthening youth protection and public safety.

"This is the first step in the right direction," BM Pagulayan said, emphasizing the importance of collaboration among government agencies, educational institutions, and organizations in prevent-

ing hazing and protecting the welfare of students.

One of the highlights of the hearing was the presentation by the Cavite Provincial Investigation and Effective Management Unit of the Philippine National Police (PNP) Cavite, which provided participants with data and updates on fraternity-related incidents in the province. The discussion of the proposed ordinance was facilitated by Provincial Board Secretary Michelle F. Alcid, allowing stakeholders to share their insights and recommendations to further enhance the measure.

The public hearing was attended by representatives from the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)-Cavite, Department of Education (DepEd)-Cavite, Association of Private Schools in Cavite, State Universities and Colleges, Office of the Provincial Information Officer, Office of the Provincial Legal Officer, Sangguniang Panlungsod/Bayan Committees on Peace and Public Safety, youth representatives, and officers of covered organizations across the province.
