MPTC GEARS UP FOR UNDAS 2025

Enhanced traffic management, shoulder lane regrading, and motorist assistance set across MPTC expressways



Metro Pacific Tollways Corporation (MPTC) is reactivating its “Biyaheng Arangkada” Motorists Assistance Program to ensure safe and convenient travel during the Undas season. With an expected surge in traffic across NLEX, SCTEX, NLEX Connector, CALAX, CAVITEX, and CCLEX, MPTC is intensifying operations through increased personnel deployment, 24/7 traffic monitoring, and quick-response teams.

Free towing for Class 1 and Class 1M (for CCLEX) vehicles to the nearest exit will be available from 6:00 AM of October 30 to 6:00 AM of

November 3 to assist motorists, while roadworks will be suspended from October 29 to November 3, except for emergency repairs, to keep traffic flowing smoothly.

To reduce bottlenecks, NLEX Corporation has regraded shoulder lanes in key areas to support counterflow operations. Motorists are advised to plan their trips ahead and avoid peak hours, particularly during the following periods:

Afternoon of October 29

Afternoon of October 30 to evening of October 31

Morning of No-

vember 1

Afternoon of November 2

Morning until noon of November 3

Around 2,000 traffic, toll, and emergency personnel will be on duty across MPTC expressways, in coordination with the PNP, LGUs, and key agencies. At CAVITEX, “Biyaheng Arangkada” will be implemented with PEA Tollway Corporation, a subsidiary of the Philippine Reclamation Authority.

Motorists can use the MPT DriveHub app for real-time traffic updates, RFID reloading, and assistance. As part of the MVP Group's efforts,

Maynilad will provide free bottled water, while Smart Communications will offer free Wi-Fi and charging stations in select areas. MPTC encourages motorists to ensure their vehicles are in good condition and RFID accounts are sufficiently loaded before traveling.

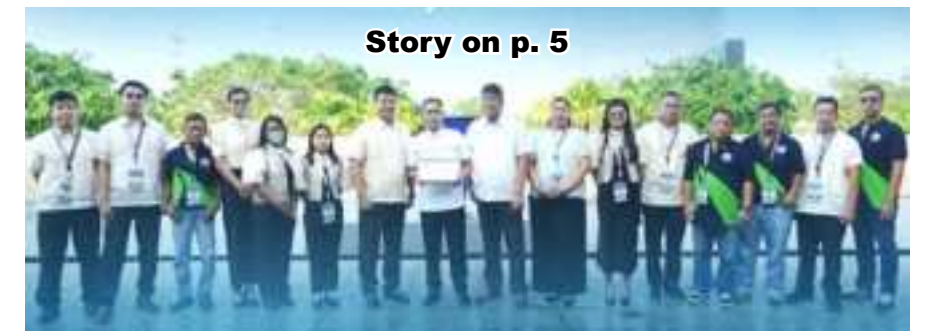

ROSARIO, CAVITE (PIA) — Every year, the coastal town of Rosario bursts with color and celebration as it holds the Tinapang Salinas Festival, a joyful tribute to the sea's abundant harvest. The annual festivity, filled with lively performances and traditional rituals, also coincides with the 180th founding anniversary of the Diocesan Shrine and Parish of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary Reina del Caracol—a testament to the town's deep faith and vibrant heritage.

A Legacy of Smoke and Flavor
The tinapa (smoked fish) industry has long been the lifeblood of Rosario. Passed down through generations, the art of smoking fish has transformed from a humble livelihood into a thriving local enterprise recognized across the country and even abroad. For many families, tinapa has not only brought sustenance but has also paved the way for better education and improved living conditions.

Though the smoky aroma of burning wood

is ever-present in the air, locals say it's a scent of hard work—and even believe the smoke drives away diseases and pests. It symbolizes perseverance, pride, and hope for a better future for their children.

The Town that Smokes Prosperity

Rosario, formerly known as Salinas, is home to the largest fish port in Region IV and a growing industrial hub thanks to the Export Processing Zone Authority (EPZA) located within its borders. Yet amid modernization, traditional tinapa-making remains a cornerstone of community life.

Prominent families have long sustained this craft. In Barangay Bagbag-I, families like Ayot Saysay, Baby Reyes, Katche Mata, and Nancy Patiga are well-known for their smoky kilns. Over in Bagbag-II, the families of Aida Delos Santos and the Palag clan continue to keep their fires burning, while in Ligdong-IV, other tinapa makers proudly uphold the trade.

Locals proudly say that the unique taste of Tinapang Salinas cannot be replicated elsewhere—it's the blend of skill, tradition, and the spirit of Salinas that makes it special.

The Secret of Salinas

The town's old name, Salinas, comes from the Latin word for salt. Long before tinapa became its signature product, Rosario was known for its salt-making industry, with an Irasan or salt factory that thrived during the hot months of March to May. Today, that legacy continues in the distinct, salty-sweet flavor of Tinapang Salinas, made from fish such as galunggong, salinase, tilapia, bangus, tamban, and lawlaw.

Locals proudly say that the unique taste of Tinapang Salinas cannot be replicated elsewhere—it's the blend of skill, tradition, and the spirit of Salinas that makes it special.

A Celebration of Sea and Spirit

The Tinapang Salinas Festival is more than a showcase of local products; it's a celebration of identity. The festivities feature a Karakol procession in honor of Poong Nuestra Señora Del Rosario, drawing throngs of devotees. Nights come alive with free concerts at the town plaza, where locals and visitors dance, sing, and celebrate their shared pride.

Sustaining Heritage and the Sea

Rosario's local government continues to support programs that protect the sea and sustain the tinapa industry. Artificial coral reefs have been planted in nearby waters to preserve marine life, ensuring the bounty that fuels the town's livelihood endures for generations.

Indeed, the tinapa industry mirrors the resilience and unity of the people of Rosario—from the salty air of the past to the smoky prosperity of today. Tinapang Salinas remains not just a delicacy but a symbol of Caviteño culture, craftsmanship, and community pride.

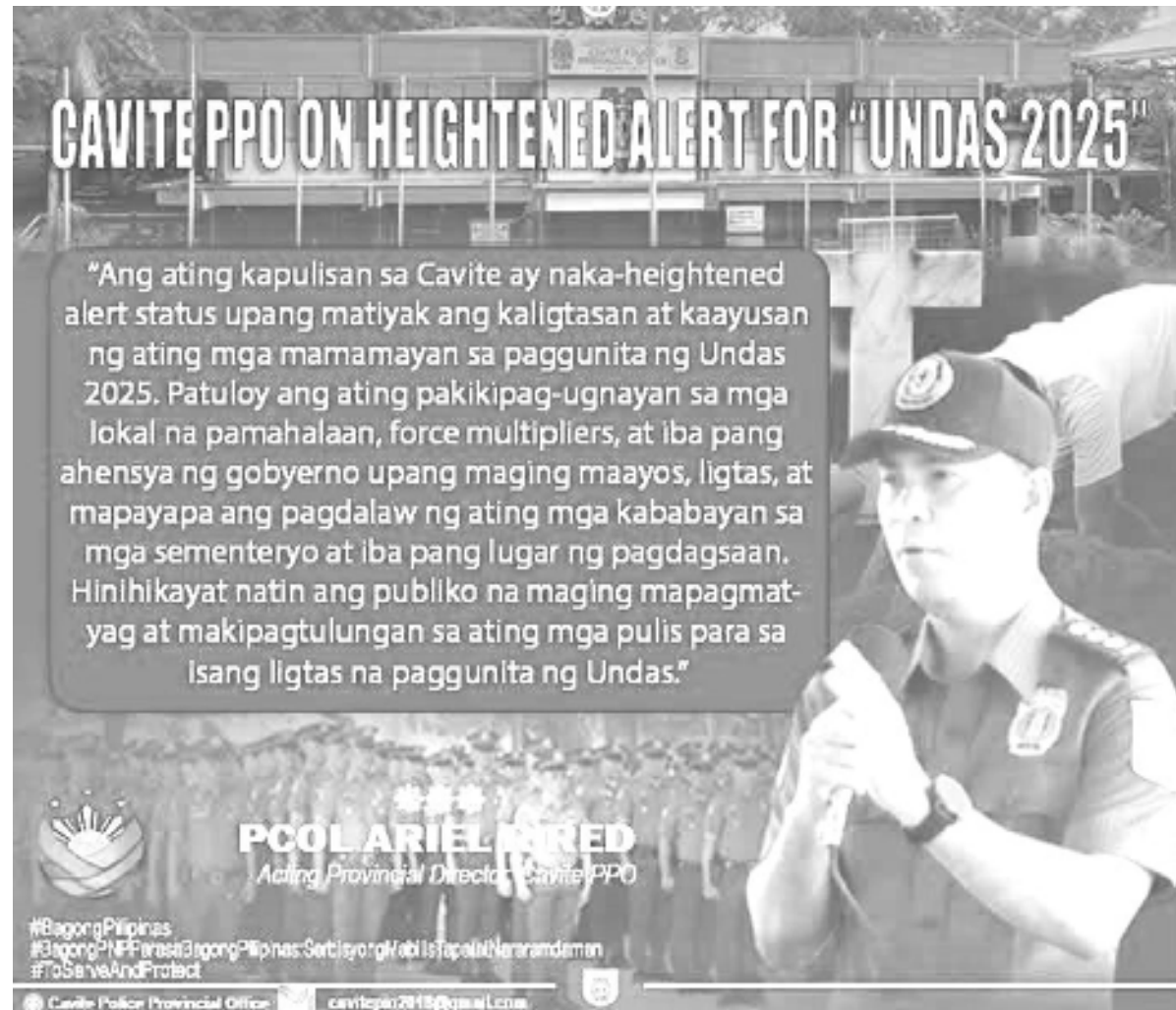

Motorist Assistance Centers (MACs) and Police Assistance Desks (PADs) will be established in key areas to provide immediate assistance and respond to any emergencies or security concerns. PCOL Red has directed all chiefs of police to conduct round-the-clock police visibility, implement traffic management and crowd control plans, and coordinate closely with Local Government Units (LGUs), the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), rescue teams, and force multipliers to maintain public safety and order.

Agri Trucks, PUVs to Enjoy 90-Day Toll Reprieve as CAVITEX Implements New Rates

MANILA, October 24, 2025 — The Toll Regulatory Board (TRB) has approved the toll rate adjustments for the Manila-Cavite Expressway (CAVITEX) following petitions filed by joint venture partners CAVITEX Infrastructure Corporation (CIC) and Philippine Reclamation Authority (PRA) in 2020 and 2023. The new rates will take effect on October 28, 2025.

To help ease the impact of the toll increase, CAVITEX’ “Abante Program” will be reactivated — a toll reprieve initiative allowing registered public utility vehicles (PUVs) and agricultural trucks to continue paying old toll rates for 90 days from implementation.

Transport groups not yet enrolled may contact 1-35000 or email customercare@mptc.com to know more about the program and how to avail.

“We appreciate the government’s affirmation to honor its contractual obligations with the Private Investors and Toll Operators,” said CAVITEX management“. While the rate adjustments are neces-

sary to ensure continued maintenance, safety, and improvement of the expressway, we also recognize the need to support sectors most affected by rising transport costs. The toll reprieve initiative seeks to strike a fair balance between infrastructure sustainability and public welfare.

New Toll Rates The TRB resolution grants the 2020 and 2023 petitions, authorizing the implementation of provisionally approved toll rates to support ongoing upgrades and maintenance activities.

CAVITEX R1 Portion (Seaside to Zapote) – VAT-inclusive rates effective October 28, 2025: Class 1: ₱35 → ₱39 Class 2: ₱70 → ₱78 Class 3: ₱104 → ₱117 CAVITEX R1 Extension Segment 4 (Zapote to Kawit):

To moderate the impact on motorists, the rate adjustment will be implemented in two tranches (2025 and 2026). First tranche rates are as follows: Class 1: ₱73 → ₱88 Class 2: ₱146 → ₱176 Class 3: ₱219 → ₱264 Infrastructure Improvements

CIC and PRA completed major infrastructure projects to ensure the expressway’s safety and efficiency, even prior to the approval of toll petitions, including:

Expansion Joint Replacement at the Parañaque Segment Bridges and Imus Viaduct, enhancing ride comfort and structural reliability

Upgraded RFID systems and installation of Automatic License Plate Recognition (ALPR) technology for faster and more seamless transactions

Ongoing pavement rehabilitation works in critical portions of both the Kawit and Parañaque segments

CIC and PRA reaffirm their commitment to deliver safe, reliable, and efficient expressways that support economic growth and regional connectivity.

Note: Due to adjustment at CAVITEX R1 portion, CAVITEX C5 Link Segment 2 (Sucat Interchange) toll rate will also be adjusted accordingly to the new VAT-inclusive rates: ₱38 (Class 1), ₱76 (Class 2), and ₱114 (Class 3).

CARD MRI Publishing House facilitated a storytelling session featuring the storybook Ang Magic Alkansiya ni Carding, attended by 35 children. The activity aimed to promote financial literacy and teach the value of saving.

A livelihood training on Kalabasa Chips

making was attended by 35 participants, aiming to empower the community by teaching them valuable skills to generate additional income and improve their livelihoods.

Furthermore, a total of 365 attendees benefited from free medical, dental, and optical check-ups, while 75 received massages, 60 had haircuts, and 55 were treated to manicures and pedicures, all for free. To combat hunger, the event also included a feeding program, serving champorado to over 100 people.

Kaunlaran Caravan is a CARD MRI initiative that brings various community development services to different areas, with the goal of uplifting and empowering local communities.

The fifth leg of the caravan is set to take place in Polomolok, South Cotabato, on August 20, 2025.
