Carmona opens PH’s first fully-integrated PWD resource, residential facility



CARMONA CITY, Cavite (PIA) — The City Government of Carmona opened the country’s first fully integrated resource center and residential care facility for Persons With Disabilities (PWD) as part of its continuous bid towards a more inclusive community.

On July 31, the Kalingyakap Integrated Shelter, Support, and Services for PWDs opened its doors to the public.

A program launched in partnership with the Delos Santos Family Foundation, the Kalingyakap Shelter features PWD-friendly facilities, including classrooms and areas for speech, physical, and occupational therapies.

Having previously been recognized by the United Nations’ Public Service Awards, Mayor Dahlia Loyola noted that the Kalingyakap Integrated Shelter was a ‘dream’ and a product of the support and involve-

ment of stakeholders and community members in their city.

“Ito na po ang katuparan ng ating pangarap, kung saan ang shelter facilities natin ay bubuksan na. Tayo ay naririto hindi lang upang i-celebrate ang blessing, kundi para i-celebrate ang mga totoong nangyayari sa City of Carmona kung saan mayroong inclusive development [where] nobody is left behind. Ito po ay nangyari sa pamamagitan ng strong political will, sustained leadership, at involvement of many stakeholders.”

As the first of its kind, the Kalingyakap Integrated Shelter, Support, and Services and its accompanying programs earned praises from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Department of Education (DepEd), and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG).

Secretary Rex

Gatchalian lauded the city, which has long been a business-friendly community, for its PWD-centered governance.

“The true mark of a progressive city is how it takes care of its citizens, more so those who are poor, marginalized, and vulnerable. Dito sa Carmona, ipinamalas ng lungsod na hindi lang sila progresibo sa imprastraktura, ease of doing business, at sa iba’t ibang larangan, kundi ipinakikita nila na pati ang kanilang number one agenda sa governance, [which] is taking care of People With Disabilities.”

Gatchalian noted that the Kalingyakap Shelter is the first facility of its kind in the country, focusing on helping PWDs adapt to society by offering various livelihood packages and psychosocial support.

“The innovation of this Center lies not in the structure itself, kundi doon sa commu-

nity-based programs na fully integrated. Most of the Learning and Resource Centers sa buong Pilipinas normally ang point of view is always as an education facility.”

Gatchalian added, “[But] Carmona took it a bit further and looked at it as part of the community—complete package of services na kasama ang livelihood, involvement ng mga magulang, [at] kasama pagtatala ng People with Disabilities sa community, and I think this is the only type of it [integrated shelter facility] right now.”

Currently, the Kalingyakap program caters to 368 PWD learners, including college students, in partnership with the Cavite State University (CvSU). The Shelter is also caring for neglected and abandoned PWDs, and can accommodate up to 20 male and female residents.

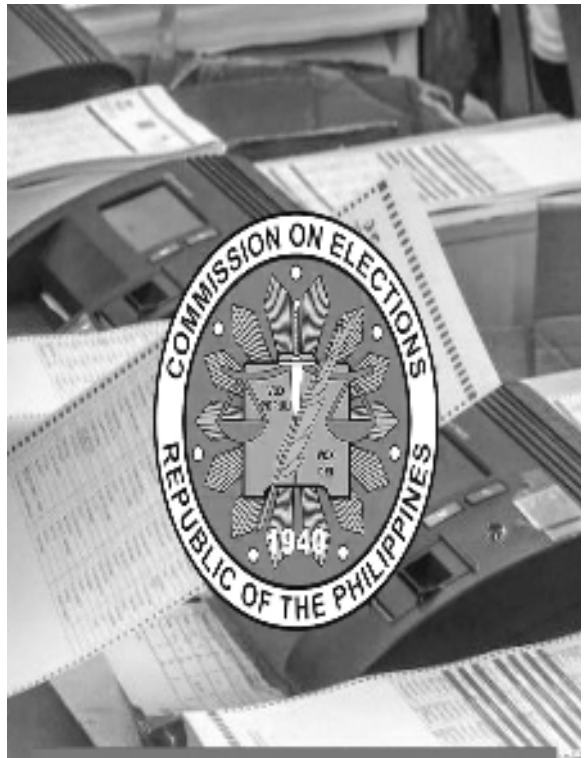

SSS, BIR strengthen interagency cooperation through landmark partnership



QUEZON CITY – The Social Security System (SSS) and the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) on Friday formalized a landmark partnership to strengthen compliance with tax and

social security laws, enhance data sharing, and improve public service delivery.

The Memorandum of Understanding (OU), signed by SSS President and Chief Executive Of-

ficer Robert Joseph M. De Claro and BIR Commissioner Atty. Charlito Martin R. Mendoza at the BIR National Office in Quezon City, establishes a framework for stronger institutional coordination

in carrying out the agencies' respective mandates.

The MOU also lays the groundwork for a Memorandum of Agreement that will govern specific collaborative initiatives, including

the establishment of the Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) as a common and reliable identifier across the BIR and the SSS to enhance data integrity, strengthen compliance monitoring, and improve ease of doing business.

PCEO De Claro said the MOU marks a significant step in aligning the mandates, expertise, and resources of the SSS and the BIR.

"We all recognize that taxes provide the resources that enable our government to deliver essential programs and services to the Filipino people. Likewise, the social security contributions are the lifeblood of SSS operations, allowing us to provide meaningful protection and financial security to millions of workers, pensioners and their families," De Claro said.

"By strengthening our collaboration between our agencies, we are creating a more coordinated and responsive government, one that makes compliance easier, improves service delivery and ultimately benefits every Filipino."

BIR Commissioner Mendoza said the MOU provides a strong foundation for sustained collaboration between the two agencies, adding that its success will ultimately be measured by "simpler processes, stronger coordination, better informed decisions and more effective public service."

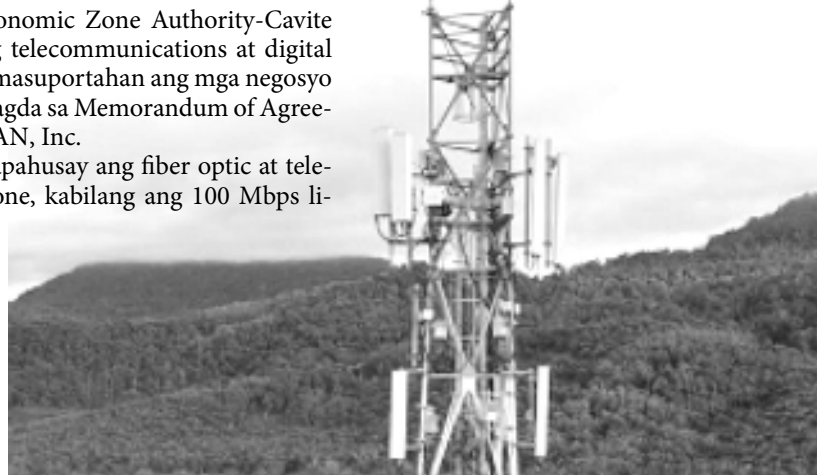
"Our mandates may be different, but our work is closely connected. Government works best when institutions trust one another enough to share responsibility, information and expertise," Mendoza said. #

SM Foundation Advances Preventive Healthcare in San Pablo City



Bringing healthcare closer to home. The SM Foundation Mobile Clinic delivers free medical services and essential care to residents at SM City San Pablo.

sario, San Isidro, Atisan, San Lucas, Barangay 6-D, and Barangay 2-D.

A total of 1,521 healthcare services were provided, including 835 medical consultations, 109 dental services, 150 optical consultations, 100 ECG tests, 84 X-rays, 92 bone scans, and free laboratory tests for blood sugar, cholesterol, uric acid, and hemoglobin.

The medical mission was made possible through the collaboration of SM Foundation, SM Supermalls, the City Health Office of San Pablo, SPC Medical, the Philippine Red Cross, the Provincial Health Office, San Pablo Infinity 104 MJF Lions Club International, and Acebedo Optical.

City Health Officer of San Pablo, Dr. Mercy-dina Adbona Caponcon, said that the greatest value of medical missions

lies in helping people detect illnesses before they become life-threatening.

"Mahalaga kahit wala pa po tayong nararamdaman at una pa lamang ang mga sintomas na ipinakita ng iyong katawan ay kailangan na po tayong magpunta kaagad [sa doctor] dahil mahalaga na wala pang komplikasyon," she explained, emphasizing that delaying check-ups can allow conditions to worsen unnoticed.

Based on her experience, hypertension and diabetes remain among the most common health concerns encountered in the city. Many patients seek consultation only after complications have already developed or after stopping their medications due to financial constraints.

She stressed that preventive healthcare remains the first and most important step in pro-

tecting one's health.

Dr. Caponcon also noted that free medical missions help connect residents to doctors, diagnostic services, medicines, and government health programs that many would otherwise struggle to access.

"Malaking tulong ang gaya po ng ginagawa ng SM Foundation sa atin pong mga kababayan dito sa San Pablo dahil nagkakaroon ng tiyansa ang lahat ng tao. Kalimitan kasi ang mga problema na sinasabi nila ay wala silang finances," she said.

Meanwhile, resident Physician of SM Foundation, Dr. Bless Bertos, explained that the program is not just providing free medicines but also focuses on identifying health risks early and guiding patients toward long-term wellness.

"Hindi lang po check-up ang ibinibigay namin sa aming medical missions. Layunin namang mabigyan ang bawat pasyente ng mas kumpleto pangangalaga, mula sa tamang diagnosis at mga kinakailangang pag-susuri hanggang sa pagbibigay ng gamot at iba pang serbisyong makatutulong sa kanilang pangmatagalang kalusugan," she shared.

As the medical mission is held annually at SM City San Pablo, healthcare providers are able to monitor patients' progress over time. Those who require continued treatment are referred to their local health centers, ensuring they receive ongoing care beyond the medical mission.
